1. Scanned copies of all Board certificates from matric onwards.
2. Scanned copy of character certificate from the head of institution last attended.
3. A valid Own/Family member mobile number/Email account. All communication will be sent through SMS and Email.
4. Recent passport size photograph scanned in 140 x 180-pixel resolution and less than 200 KB in size.
5. Students with a gap of one year or more must have to accept declaration mentioned under personal details.
6. The candidates from other Boards/University, must submit:
7. Eligibility certificate from H.P. Board/University showing equivalence.
8. Migration Certificate.
9. SC/ST scanned certificate for those seeking relaxation or weightage.
10. The candidates belong to IRDP, NCC, NSS, Sports, Cultural Quota those seeking relaxation or weightage must upload scanned copy of certificate
11. All students from 2nd year onwards must have to fill HP University Roll No.
12. All girl candidates have to upload scanned copy of Bonafide Himachali Certificate for getting Exemption from Tuition fee as per Notification. Edu H(8) 3 (8) 1/76 dated 29 - 06-2001.

Undergraduate Programmes Offered:

(I) B.A. (Arts)

a. English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Economics, Geography, Political Science, History, Mathematics, Music, Sociology, Tourism and Travel Management, Physical Education.

(II) B.Sc. (Science/Physical Science)

a. Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Computer Science & Application, Botany, Zoology, Chemistry.

(III) B.Com. (Commerce)

a. Commerce.

Post Graduate in English:

The Schedule of admission to 20 seats in M.A. English will be displayed on the college Notice Board. The basis for admission to M.A. English shall be merit, which shall be determined on the basis of qualifying examination in accordance of H.P. University in this regard.

Eligibility Conditions for M.A.:

- a) Age limit as on 1st July 2023 shall be 26 years for boys/ 28 years for girls/ 29 years for SC/ST candidates (Both for Boys and Girls).
- b) Student seeking admission to M.A. English must have secured 45% aggregate marks in the subject of English in three years of UG Degree or 50% aggregate marks in qualifying examination.

NOTE: While determining the merit 5% Weightage is given to student who studied Elective English at undergraduate level.

RULES FOR ADMISSION AND SUBJECT COMBINATIONS

Note: - Rules for Admission are subject to change as per Himachal Pradesh University notification from time to time.

A. GENERAL RULES

1. Admission will be strictly on fulfilment of eligibility conditions.
2. Any gap in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by evidence.
3. An applicant who has passed Prabhakar is not eligible for admission.
4. Application forms must be complete in all respects along with the following documents:
 - Original Character Certificate from the Institution last attended. (Issued not earlier than six months).
 - Self-attested copy of detailed marks certificate of the previous examination Passed.
 - Self-attested copy of Matriculation Examination/ date of Birth Certificate.
 - Two Passport size latest photographs of the candidate. (One to be pasted on the admission form and another to be pasted on the Identity Card).

- A passport size photograph of the parents/guardian to be affixed on PTA membership form. (Guardian means only blood relation but not a present student of this college.) However, the voting right is vested only with the parents, if alive. Only parents are eligible to be elected as PTA president/member/off ice bearers of PTA executive.
 - A copy of Aadhar Card.
 - Documentary Proof must be attached for IRDP/BPL/SC/ST/CBC/Physically Challenged and Sports & Cultural Activities Participation.
5. A Student must produce original Certificates at the time of admission.
 6. Candidates coming from Board/University other than H.P. Board of School Education/ Himachal Pradesh University must produce migration certificate in Original. Those who have passed first year/second year of a degree course from another University will have to produce Equivalence Certificate from Himachal Pradesh University.
 7. Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled if he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information or conceals any fact/facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
 8. Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the principal can refuse admission if the Conduct of a student had not been up to the mark during the previous years.
 9. Initially, all admissions will be provisional subject to the approval by the H.P. University. As and when University results are declared the students shall have to deposit the photocopy of the mark sheet in the office and ensure their regular Admission in their respective class.
 10. A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid down by the Himachal Pradesh University. However, such students must obtain the approval of the concerned Admission Committee.
 11. Girl student's seeking admission in any class must bring an attested copy of Bonafide Himachali Certificate to avail the fee concession. (Tuition Fee only.)
 12. Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy of 40% disability certificate.
 13. Candidates seeking admission from other colleges must get clearance from Time Table Committee.
 14. Candidate seeking admission for the first time in this college must be accompanied by their parents/ guardian.
 15. The principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission.
 16. The admission will be purely on merit basis and on the number of seats allotted to each major subject.
 17. The number of seats in each major subject are 80 in case B.A. and B.Sc. whereas in B.Com. there are 140 seats available.
 18. The admission will be as per 120-point roster recently notified by H.P. University.
 19. Admission is open for all students on roll on basis who are otherwise eligible without waiting the final result. Roll-on system means students who appeared in P' year will go the 2nd year & who appeared in 2nd year will go to 3rd year. He will have to fulfil all the formalities laid down by college. This will help regular teaching in time.
 20. There will be no Provision of admission as per ordinance after June every year as per Hon'ble High Court decision, no admission will be given after the schedule, Principal Concerned will be responsible for strict compliance of admission schedule.

B. ELIGIBIUTY FOR ADMISSION FOR THE UNDER GRADUATE (UG) PROGRAMMES

B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. 1st Year

1. Any student who has passed +2 examination from any recognized Board/ University established by law in India or any examination recognized equivalent thereto, shall be eligible for admission in 1st year of 3rd year degree pass course provided that

a. the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with arts/humanities stream shall be given preference in admission to B.A. Program.

b. the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc./B.C.A. Program.

c. the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com./B.B.A. Program.

d. the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Mathematics stream shall be given preference in admission to B.C.A. Program.

2. An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on 01-07-2023 i.e., must not have been born earlier to 01/07/2000. However, in case of SC /ST students, relaxation in age up to three years is allowed as per rules. However, in case of overage Candidates, the Vice Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to six months.

3. Minimum pass percentage for admission in different faculties/programs is given below:
(Change in minimum pass percentage is subject to the orders of the Himachal Pradesh University.)

a) Bachelor of Arts: 33%

Note: 10+2 Students placed under compartment in +2 class are not eligible for admission in first year of three-year degree programs in Arts/Commerce/Science.

b) Bachelor of Commerce

i) 33% for girls only

ii) 40% for those boys who have passed examination under commerce group at +2 level.

iii) 45% for all other boys.

c) Bachelor of Science: 45%

(Note: For determining the eligibility, percentage of 0.5 and above shall be considered as 1)

4. Relaxation of 5% marks for SC and ST students for admission to science and commerce Faculties will be given.

5. A student seeking admission to B.A. 1st Year with Mathematics as one of the subjects should have either 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in mathematics at +2 level.

6. Candidate having passed 10+2 examination in four subjects (including English) from any university/Board recognized by law can seek admission.

7. Admission is open to anybody who has passed intermediate or an equivalent examination in four subjects from any recognized Indian University or Board (Five in case of National Institute of Open School)

8. Only passed candidates of NIOS will be admitted if otherwise eligible.

9. Admission is also open to a candidate who has passed an equivalent examination from any foreign University subject to the approval granted either by Vice-Chancellor or by the committee authorized to determine equivalence.

10. A student with result RL (UMC) will not be given admission in the college.

11. A student failed in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. III will not be admitted again.

FOR THE DEGREE

1. The candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a college affiliated to the H.P. University for a period not less than three academic years (and not more than five academic years), should have passed the examination prescribed and fulfil such

conditions as have been prescribed therefor.

2. For the degree (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.C.A./B.B.A.) the passing out students will have to cumulate minimum of 128/132 successful credit hours of course work over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission Provided that not more than three attempts will be allowed to pass a course.

DURATION (TIME FRAME):

The UG (TDC) program is for a minimum period for three years and a maximum of five Years from the date of admission of the candidate. There is yearly system of examination for students.

B.A. (Arts) Programme: There are total 8 papers which are to be studied in B.A.-1st year, which includes: 2 papers for Core/Major, 2 papers for Minor, 2 compulsory papers and 2 papers for Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses.

Note:

1. For B.A.-2nd Year, 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC's) will have to study additionally along with 2 Compulsory Courses of English and Hindi/Sanskrit by the students from their Core/Major subjects.

2. In B.A.-3rd Year, 2 General Elective (GE) Courses (other than their core/Major subject, to be decided by the college/faculty, later on) will have to study along with 2 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC's) additionally by the students.

(II) B.Sc. Programme:

STUDENT'S COURSE WISE CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT (CCA) AND EVALUATION

All courses (Core, DSE, AECC & SEC) involve an evaluation system of students that has the following two components:

- Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) accounting for 30% of the final grade that a student gets in a course; and
- Annual Examination accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that the student gets in a course.

a) **Continuous Comprehensive Assessment:**

This would have the following components:

I. Classroom Attendance:

Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures I Tutorials I Practical. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the annual Examination.

- Those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
- Those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical Certificate from a Government Hospital.

The exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g., NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports, etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in the annual examination cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.

Candidates who are getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for co-curricular activities, will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below:

II. Classroom Attendance Incentive:

Those students having greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to existing attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows (out of 5): -

- i) 75% to 79% - 1 mark
- ii) 80% to 84% - 2 marks
- iii) 85% to 89% - 3marks
- iv) 90% to 94% - 4 marks
- v) 95% & above - 5 marks

III. House examination

There will be one house examination, to be conducted when approx. 2/3 of the syllabus has been covered. This examination will be for 15 marks and will be conducted by the college in consultation with the teachers.

In laboratory courses (having only practical (P) component), the students will be tested on the basis of laboratory exercises given by the course teacher concerned. Rest of the procedure will remain the same as above. The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of seminar, assignment, term paper etc. that the course teacher might give to the students.

b) ANNUAL EXAMINATION

The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of an annual examination that will be for three hours duration and will be covering the whole syllabus of the course.

Note: Only those students will be allowed to appear in the annual examination who have been successful in the CCA.

- A candidate who does not pass the annual examination in any course(s) or due to some reason is not able to appear in this examination, other conditions being fulfilled, and so is considered as 'Fail', shall be permitted to appear in such failed course(s) in the subsequent supplementary/annual examination as per the instructions issued by HP University Shimla time to time.
- The registration for the annual examination will be done at the time of the enrolment

for the course at the beginning of the session. The fee for the annual examination will also be collected at that time as decided by the university from time to time.

- A student, who fulfills all the requirements for appearing in annual examination, is unable to appear in the examination to complete it on account of his/her own serious Illness, accident, or on account of the death of near relative (mother, father, brother and sister), or the dates of state or national level examinations falls on dates of the annual examination may be allowed to appear in the annual examination in the next academic year. Permission to sit in the examination will be permitted by college Principal/Director on the production of a valid certificate/document from the competent authority. The college will send the name of the student to the Registration and Migration Cell for information

GENERAL REFUND OF FEE RULES

If a student chooses to withdraw from the program of study in which he/she enrolled, the institution shall be following four-tier system for the refund of fees remitted by the student.

Note: - (Inclusive of course fee and non-tuition fees but exclusive of caution money and security deposit).

1. In case of (1) in the table above, the College shall deduct an amount not more than 10% of the aggregate fees as processing charges from the refundable amount.
2. Fee shall be refunded by the College to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him / her in this regard.
3. Refund forms will be available at the main counters 1 & 2 of the college (the photocopy of bank passbook of the candidate only be attached).
4. But in all other Cases of the students continuing their studies, the Library Security will be

refunded if he/she will apply within six months from the date of leaving the Institute after completing the full course of studies.

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR REALISING FEES & FUNDS:

1. a) Every student must pay his/her dues on the dates notified from time to time. A student will have to pay dues for 1st quarter at the time of admission.
- b) The dues for the 2nd quarter will have to be paid as per the schedule notified by the college authority.
- c) Failure to pay dues on due date will entail a fine of Rs. 10/- per day.
- d) In case of non-payment of dues in advance, the name of the student will be struck off from the rolls at the end of that month.
- e) Registration fee will not be charged from student migrating from another college, if he/she is already registered with H.P. University. Other dues will have to be paid from the month of joining this institution provided student has not paid the dues in the college from which he/she has migrated.
2. The name of a student will be struck off from the rolls of the college if he/she remains absent without leave for ten days or more in any class/subject (Theory/Practical).
3. Every student will have to procure No Dues Certificate from the Library, NCC, NSS, Sports, Hostel, College Canteen, Fee Clerk, etc. if he wants to leave the college.
4. The principal can expel a student from the college if he/she is found guilty of misconduct.
5. The security deposit will lapse if a student does not apply for refund of security within one year of leaving the college.
6. The fine claimed for absence has to be paid along with dues, while fines imposed otherwise have to be deposited by the date announced.
7. In case the name of a student is struck off for the first time the re-admission is permissible within first 10 days with a fee of Rs. 100/- on the prescribed Performa, if name is struck off for the second time re-admission is done within 7 days with a fee of Rs. 200/- in the presence of the parents. After that no re admission is allowed. For the condition of 75% attendance, the lectures will be counted from 1st official teaching day.

SC/ST Girls Hostel

A Hostel for SC/ST Girl Students has been constructed recently near the college building which will provide a very good facility to the Girl Students. It has capacity of accommodation for 105 girls.

Rules for Hostel

1. **Curfew:** There is usually a specified time by which students must return to the hostel in the evening. This is primarily for safety and security reasons.
2. **Visitation Hours:** Visitors, especially of the opposite gender, may be allowed only during certain hours and in designated areas of the hostel.

4. **Room Inspection:** Periodic inspections of rooms may be conducted by hostel authorities to ensure cleanliness, safety, and adherence to rules.
5. **Personal Safety:** Students may be required to take precautions to ensure their own safety, such as locking doors and windows, and not letting strangers into the hostel.
6. **Alcohol and Substance Use:** Hostels often have strict policies against the possession and consumption of alcohol, drugs, and other prohibited substances on the premises.

- Hostel Charges per month (Includes electricity bill, boarding charges, misc.): Rs. 1000
- Mess Charges per month: Rs. 3000 approx.

Library

1. The college Library is one of the best in the region with a very rich collection of books and journals. The library has different sections for text books. Books are also issued for the whole sessions to the needy poor students on the recommendation of the tutor.
2. Generally, two books are issued at a time for 14 days and the librarian has the right to recall the books at any time.
3. Reference books are not issued.
4. In case of loss of books, the student will have to either replace the book or pay the fine in addition to the present price of the books.

Leave Rules

1. Student can proceed on leave mentioning specific reasons with prior permission. For this he/she should fill in the leave form to be supplied by the college (costing Rs. 5/- per booklet) at the time of admission.
2. A tutor can recommend leave up to three days. Leave up to one week will be sanctioned by the senior tutor. In case the senior tutor is on leave & leave for more than a week will be sanctioned by the principal on the recommendation of the tutor.
3. Leave during House Examination will be sanctioned by the principal on the recommendation of the tutor.
4. Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate.

Annual Prize Distribution Function

The annual prize distribution function is a cherished tradition in educational institutions where outstanding achievements and contributions of students are acknowledged and celebrated. Tutorial Groups

Every student is assigned a tutorial group as per the major subject opted by him/her. Each group is guided by the teacher of the major subject who is also the tutor for that group. The identity cards of the students will also be signed by their respective tutors. A mentoring session will be held every month for each group. During this session students can seek advice for their academic as well as personal problems.

Counselling & Career Guidance

Keeping in mind the career of the students, the college runs a Counselling & Career Guidance cell. This Cell runs various campaign Programmes to make the students aware of various career opportunities available to them. In this regard, seminars/guest lectures are organized by Counselling & Career Guidance Cell.

NCC

NCC facility is available in the college for boys as well as girls. There are limited seats available so the recruitment is done by a selection procedure to fill the seats. The cadets who qualify 'C' certificate examination with grade 'A' or 'B' are directly called for SSB interview for entry in the forces as an Officer through "NCC SPECIAL ENTRY SCHEME" twice in a year in the months of February and October.

NSS

The college has one unit of National Service Scheme (NSS). The enrolment of the students to NSS is done by a selection procedure. Seven days special camp will be held in the last week of December 2021. Note: The students can opt either for NCC or NSS.

Rovers & Rangers

Rovers & Rangers have also been introduced in the college and the students can opt for Rovers & Rangers provided, if they are not enrolled in NCC or NSS.

College Magazine (BINWA)

The college Magazine "BINWA" is published to give expression to the creative talents of our student. The magazine has seven sections, each section edited by a member of the staff and assisted by a student editor.

Sports and Co-Curricular Activities

The college provides excellent facilities to sports persons who wish to make in games. The college prepares teams for University Championships in almost all disciplines. A committee of teachers decides the formation of represent the college in different tournaments. No student of the college can play for an outside team without the written permission of the principal. The college also provides guidance to students in various cultural activities. There are committees which prepare students for participation in various competitions. These teams are Music (Vocal & Instrumental), Debate, Declamation, Elocution, Symposium, Quiz, Drama, Poetic

Symposium & Dance. College. Annual Athletic Meet will be held in the 2nd week of December, 2023.

Conduct and Discipline

Discipline is the most important part of the student's life. Violation of rules and regulation will not be tolerated. The principal can impose fine, suspension or rustication of any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as is listed below.

1. a) Any act of ragging on or around campus will be severely dealt with. Ragging implies harassment/physical or mental torture to another student by a student or a group of students. Any student found associated in such notorious activities will be guilty of gross misconduct. Remember Ragging Is cognizable offence.

b) Anybody found guilty of writing obscene language on blackboards, walls or furniture.

c) Aimlessly loitering in the verandahs, making noise or attempting to disturb classes.

d) Smoking or taking drugs/ alcohol etc. in the campus.

e) Any attempt to damage the furniture or other property in campus.

f) Bringing unwanted outside person to the campus or sitting unnecessarily within the Campus.

g) Pasting posters on the walls or notices on the Notice Board without permission of the principal.

2. Students who participate in sports or other extra-curricular activities/educational Tourisms must produce written permission from their parents/guardians.

3. All students must always carry with them their duly completed identity cards which is issued to them at the time of admission. They must produce their identity cards whenever demanded by any teacher or the principal.

4. Parents/guardians are requested to remain in touch with the principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards in the college. 5. Outsiders are not allowed in the college campus.

5. Students are expected to respect teachers, staff, and other authority figures within the college.

6. Regular attendance is mandatory. Excessive absences or truancy may result in academic penalties or disciplinary measures.

7. Use of mobile phones in the campus is strictly prohibited. Access to inappropriate content or cyberbullying is prohibited within the college campus.

8. Students are responsible for their own safety and the safety of others. They should adhere to safety protocols, follow evacuation procedures during emergencies, and report any safety concerns to college authorities.

9. Clear consequences for violations of conduct and discipline rules should be outlined. These may include warnings, detention, suspension, expulsion, or other disciplinary actions as deemed appropriate by college authorities.

AS PER THE ORDER OF HON'BLE SUPREME COURT AND STATE GOVERNMENT, RAGGING IS ILLEGAL AND IS COMPLETELY PROHIBITED AND BANNED BOTH INSIDE AND OUTSIDE THE COLLEGE CAMPUS. ANYBODY CAUGHT IN INDULGING IN THIS EVIL EXERCISE SHALL FACE PENALTY UNDER LAW. ANY ACT EVEN REMOTELY SUGGESTIVE OF RAGGING SHOULD BE REPORTED IMMEDIATELY TO COLLEGE AUTHORITIES.
